



Open PHACTS wins Linked Open Data Award in inaugural European Linked Data Contest

Vienna, Austria – The Open PHACTS consortium is proud to have been awarded first prize in the Linked Open Data Award category of the European Linked Data Contest (ELDC).

The ELDC has been established to recognise Europe's crème de la crème of linked data and semantic web achievements. Prizes are awarded to stories, products, projects or persons presenting novel and innovative projects, products and industry implementations involving linked data. The ELDC also aims to build a directory of the best European projects in the domains of linked data and the semantic web.

An international jury of ambassadors from over 15 European countries elected Open PHACTS as the winner, judging that the Open PHACTS project excelled in all aspects of the contest's assessment criteria:

- shows a high degree of innovation
- triggers network effects
- embraces open standards
- proves technological matureness
- shows great potential to be utilised in multiple domains
- achieves a high degree of comprehensibility for users and the public

Open PHACTS is honoured to be chosen as the first winner of the ELDC's Linked Open Data Award, and to be included in the ELDC directory of European linked data and semantic web projects.

The Open PHACTS Project

The Open PHACTS project is a knowledge management project of the Innovative Medicines Initiative, which began in March 2011. The project has received support from the IMI Joint Undertaking under grant agreement n° 115191, and has developed the Open PHACTS Discovery Platform to answer key scientific questions for applied life sciences research and development. This platform connects open data from 12 different sources including chemical compounds, protein targets, biological pathways and tissues, and diseases.

The 30-member consortium includes academic and pharmaceutical industrial partners, and has developed an additional community of application developers and smaller enterprises to use the Open PHACTS Discovery Platform to meet the needs of drug discovery scientists. The data integrated by Open PHACTS currently contains over three billion triples, and the diversity and size of data sets are growing rapidly.
